

## Woikoski's new hydrogen fuelling station opened in Gothenburg, Sweden, on 26 October 2015

Woikoski's first fuelling station outside Finland began serving users in Gothenburg, Sweden, on Ruskvädersgatan 12 on 26 October. The new hydrogen fuelling station is part of the TEN-T network now under construction in Europe. This network is slated to include, for example, 400 filling stations in Germany, all to be built by 2020. Woikoski wants to be involved in the construction of a European vehicle-fuel network based on clean and renewable energy.

The fuelling station was officially opened by the Swedish minister of infrastructure Anna Johansson (together with Clas Palmberg, Woikoski owner and chairman of the Board) who said that this was a big step for Gothenburg towards sustainable transportation. Representatives from among others Woikoski, Hydrogen Sweden and Sweco all held a short speech of how important this step was for Sweden but not least for Gothenburg. The infrastructure minister received the HIT-2-Corridors report by Cecilia Wallmark which has been working with the project since the start.
